GCCS was building a playground on their school's new location. Rubber Venture Corp.'s rubber mulch is a sustainable product that provides a safe and durable surface for children.



# **Background**

Guelph Community Christian School is a charitable organization that has offered Guelph-based elementary school children a versatile, Christian education since 1961. In September of 2012, the school opened its doors to a new location. It was

important for the new playground to be environmentally-friendly, and to make children's safety the top priority. Since the school is separate from the public board, all funding is raised via sponsorship, grants and pledges.

# **Transforming Communities**

In September 2012, Guelph Community Christian School (GCCS) opened the doors to its new location. To ensure the school's new playground used one of the safest, most environmentally-friendly materials available, they decided to install Rubber Venture Corp.'s rubber mulch as playground surfacing. Not only is the mulch known for safety in the event of a fall, it is also a sustainable product made of rubber from recycled tires.

This rubber mulch is made exclusively from forklift truck tires. Since these tires have both white and black rubber, the mulch that they produce is light gray in colour, which reflects heat and reduces any heat island effects. The resulting product is much cooler to the touch than similar surfaces making for a comfortable surface for children to play on.

This product demonstrates that it is possible to manufacture a superior product from waste rubber that is able to compete in the existing wood mulch

market. It produces an aesthetically pleasing playground surface that will deter injuries, wood rot and insects.

The student population at GCCS ranges in age from three to 14 years old. A well-engineered playground opens the door to good communication among the grades.

Of the project, Bob Moore, Chief Operating Officer at GCCS, said, "We're thrilled that OTS supported the GCCS with funding, allowing us to employ a playground surface made from recycled materials. This project is a great demonstration of the sustainability practices that we teach."
