Background

Kawartha Village Co-op has not had a playground since 2005, when the original structures were deemed unsafe and subsequently demolished. There has been a void in the community of 80 townhouses and 200 residents ever since, and funding a replacement play area has been a long-standing challenge for Peterborough residents. As a result, creating a safe new playground has been a

growing priority for the Co-op. The community started by raising money through simple fundraising events such as bake sales and car washes, and supplemented this by applying for grants to secure the funding they needed to build a new playground.

Transforming Communities

In 2013, Kawartha Village Co-op received funding through multiple sources including OTS' Community Grant Program, enabling the group to begin the community playground project on Lansdowne Street East.

The playground was constructed using SofSURFACES SofTILE recycled rubber surfacing. The product's durability, eco-friendly attributes and user safety influenced Kawartha Village Co-op's decision to use SofTILE over traditional alternatives such as sand, gravel, mulch

and cement.

The durable rubber tiles, made from recycled scrap tires, also show fewer signs of wear and tear from high impact use, and can be easily removed for upgrades or re-installation, resulting in long-term maintenance cost savings.

In addition, SofTILE was designed to reduce the risk of head injury, and has one of the best Head Injury Criteria (HIC) ratings when compared with its



competitors.

“We feel really confident about the surface and its durability. Once it’s installed, it’s good for a really long time,” said Candida Clarke, Playground Committee Chair.

In addition to being safe and durable, it was vital that the playground be accessible for all members of the community, and the SofTILERubber surface helps achieve this goal as it is much easier for wheelchairs to access the area, when compared with sand or pebbles.

The long-awaited playground is now open to all members of the Peterborough community.

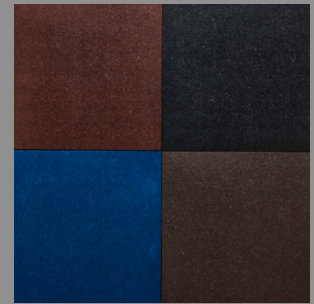
